### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Management Committee has agreed to take the next step to renew our lease for another four years. We have had a meeting with the Council representative Geno Costin (Sport and Recreation Officer, Lifestyle and Community Services, Brisbane City Council) who expressed his satisfaction with how the studio is looking and how we are handling things.

The main result from the meeting is the knowledge that we do not have to outlay \$5,750 each year as this amount is offset by our contribution to the maintenance and cleaning of the building. We just need to keep records of time and money spent as proof of the contribution.

Our main obligation is to maintain a clean and safe environment, which we do, and I would like to thank all those who do the cleaning jobs with such diligence! We think that the lease arrangement is fair and to stay here in our own place is a huge advantage.

It is a big relief and I think that we can all relax now and enjoy all the hard work that Anna and David have done, get a feeling of ownership and when we are ready decide if we want to apply for grants to upgrade our studio.

It has been a privilege for me to get to know our committee members during my initiation as president and I can report that your group is in good hands!

A Disability Parking Space will go ahead with a 30 minute time limit out the front of the studio. If you have a disability sticker you can ignore this and park there for as long as you like.

Adele has done a great job organising tutored workshops throughout the year. Please take a look at these and if you are not interested for yourself, maybe you know someone who is. 'Word of mouth' is always a great way of getting things out there.

Our trusty treasurer, Pat, has replaced the eftpos machine that cost us \$750 per year with a "square reader" box, an mpos. This little box only costs \$100 and that's it, no yearly fee. Bravo, Pat!

I look forward to our Annual Exhibition. See you there! Mary.



# **JOHN RIGBY**

(09.12.1922 - 18.10.2012)

JOHN RIGBY showed in many of Brisbane's Half Dozen Group of Artists Annual Exhibitions during the 1950's.

He also exhibited in national touring exhibitions shown in state or regional galleries. e.g. Australian Women's Weekly Art Prize, Archibald, Wynne, Sulman, and Moran National Portrait.

He was awarded a Diploma in Fine Art in January, 1951 and returned to painting and freelancing in commercial art at Noble Bartlett (later George Patterson Noble Bartlett) in Brisbane.

His first showing in the Archibald Prize was in 1953 with a portrait of Jon Molvig. His first one-man exhibition was at The Johnston Gallery, Bowen Hills. He began presenting private art classes at St. Mary's Church Hall in Kangaroo Point, 1954.



### MONDAY REPORT

Monday group has a regular attendance of 12 and often a few more faithfuls. **Barbara Ryan,** as Convenor, is full of ideas working out with our model agency the model for each week. It could be a ballerina or a model in a special outfit. Sometimes the props make the setting more interesting.

The last Monday of the month is life and begins with short poses with a longer pose for a painting after morning tea. Other Mondays the clothed model remains in the same portrait pose, some artists can do three or four drawings while others do one thorough painting or drawing.

There's a lot to learn as we walk around in the breaks seeing different media applied. We appreciate Barbara's thoughtfulness ... supplying iced water and replenishing when any supplies have run out. The quiet atmosphere makes it a meditative experience.































### TUESDAY REPORT

Tuesday attracts those who like to work in the studio on their own projects and **Lin Hives** is our encouraging convenor. At present we have a regular 8 or 9 and it swells each fortnight with Shaun and his support worker from Uniting Care.

A few weeks ago, Shaun brought along a book with photos of his recent works. We have a pleasant morning as we work. Sometimes a little quiet chatter and sometimes a CD playing.

We all bring along a yummy morning tea to share after which we have an optional critique if you want a helpful comment or two. There are always more encouraging positives. One or two work on still life or even go outside to paint. Others sit with their photos or iPads working on their current work which can be in any media. Because we don't need to pay a model, this 10am till 1pm session is only \$7 for members and \$10 for non-members.




























### THURSDAY REPORT

# FRIDAY pm REPORT


