
2016 AGM & Committee



To the dismay of Australian consumers, postage rates have increased from 70 cents per standard letter to \$1.00!!

As you would appreciate, this increase will **significantly add to the costs** of mailing correspondence to HDGA members. In addition, the delivery time is now longer than previously guaranteed time frames and so it also means that those members who are currently receiving notifications, newsletters and other important correspondence by mail,

are being disadvantaged.
