

STREETS OF OUR TOWN

Fifty years ago, a local couple cruised Brisbane taking happy snaps of home, sweet home.

If you saw someone in a pink Cadillac outside your house taking photos of it, you might be a bit perturbed.
But back in the 1960s and 1970s it was a more trusting world, so Frank and Eunice Corley went about their work without too much fuss.



Even so, people were curious, and you can see folks in some of their photos coming out to see what's going on. It's intriguing stuff and the subject matter of a fascinating new exhibition at the State Library of Queensland.



Home: a suburban obsession, explores the social, historical and cultural foundations of our homes through the incredible legacy of the Corley's.

This Brisbane couple made a business out of taking photos of people's homes and selling prints to the homeowners, or calendars and cards featuring images of their dwellings. They took upwards of 300,000 photos and in 1995, 67 boxes of them featuring 61,490 prints, were donated to the State Library of Queensland. It's one of the largest single photographic collections of Australian housing in existence.

Sorting through them has been quite a job. The exhibition features rare and original photos of Queensland homes and yours could be among them. An interactive map allows visitors to search for images of their homes and there's a virtual reality streetscape, a soundscape, and complementary art works by artists including Queenslander Tracey Moffatt.


Looking at old black and white photos of Brisbane houses, which looked pretty barren without much in the way of gardens back then, doesn't sound that exciting, but as State Librarian and CEO

Vicki McDonald points out "the exhibition is so much more than a story of bricks and mortar. It is about the everyday hopes and dreams of Queenslanders and how it has changed over the years".

There's a wonderful video in the show in which a restored old pink Cadillac prowls along Brisbane streets with an actor playing the part of snapper Frank Corley. The videos also feature interviews and homeowner's stories.

On the State Library web-site you can check to see if your house is in the collection. It's easy to use and a lot of fun when you find your house. I found our house.
