
The Australian's Review Magazine (11th-12 May) had a story about ...

George Wilson Cooper.

(1912-1998) HDGA Member 1951-1961.

George Wilson Cooper was born at Coombs, Suffolk, in the UK. He came to Queensland at a young age.

He studied drawing subjects with Martyn Roberts and commercial art with William Bustard at the Central Technical College 1927-30 but was largely self-taught. He worked as a commercial artist in Brisbane 1931-37 before being employed as a cartoonist at The Telegraph Newspaper in 1937.

He married Mavis (Mae) Annie Euston on 10 November 1937; a son (Wilson) and three daughters (Margaret, Anne and Marion) were born. He served with the Australian Imperial Forces 1941-44 before returning to The Telegraph and was employed until 1958.

Subsequently he worked as an illustrator, animator and graphic designer before being appointed Instructor/Senior Instructor/ Officer-in-Charge of Visual Communications, Queensland College of Art 1969-76.

Cooper exhibited watercolours with the Brisbane Group of Artists 1948-53, The Half Dozen Group of Artists 1951-61 and the Marburg Art Group.

He was a founding member of the Queensland Society of Sculptors in 1968 (President 1971-73) and thereafter largely focused on the production of sculpture.

Wilson Cooper was a man of many talents ... an accomplished watercolourist, proficient cartoonist and animator, a capable sculptor and a respected teacher. He won the L. J. Harvey Prize for Drawing 1967 and the Pedersen Art Prize 1980.



BRUSH WITH THE LAW.

Police have been called in after the Queensland daughter of legendary Australian painter (Noel Wood) uncovered more than a dozen fakes for sale in an interstate art auction.

My curiosity was aroused.

Who is this artist who lived and painted for 60 years on Bedarra Island off Mission Beach, N.Q.?



Noel Wood Artist/Painter. Born 1912. Died 2001.

Wood began successful exhibitions in Brisbane and Sydney from the late 1930s. He also exhibited in group exhibitions at the Australian Art Academy, Melbourne in 1939. His images of his tropic idyll captured the public's imagination and at that time, he was possibly the most widely recognised artist in Australia. His landscape subjects of the tropical north found ready appeal.

Later in 1947, Wood lived in Europe painting in Ireland and France and by March 1949, he was living in London. By May 1950, he was conducting art classes in Cairns.

He then worked as an assistant art director for the film industry in the USA for two years before returning to Australia in about 1957. He stopped painting in the 1970s to devote himself to his garden.

Three works were included in the 'Exhibition of Queensland Art' at the Queensland Art Gallery in 1951 and other group exhibitions include 'Queensland Artists of Fame and Promise' (Brisbane) in 1953, the Gold Coast City Art Prizes 1968 and 1971.
