
#### 3. STUDIO LIBRARY



# Bus Trip to Mt Tamborine Open Art Studios

Saturday 30th April saw a busload of members and friends travel to Mt Tamborine to tour the open art studios there. Below are two great accounts of the trip.

#### From Pat Hunter, Treasurer

Each year some of the Scenic Rim artists open their studios to the public.

This includes Mt. Tamborine, Beaudesert, Boonah, Harrisville, Barney View, Canungra and Beechmont taking turns over several weekends.

The Half Dozen Group of Artists decided to visit Mt. Tamborine by bus. We had 22 passengers.

We left the studio at 9a.m. and returned at 4.30p.m. after a very interesting day of meeting the artists and viewing their fabulous works.

First stop was to meet Maki Horanai, a Japanese artist whose art is evocative and serene. Her paintings and ceramics conjuring up small villages where Maki was raised. While there we also visited a section of the studio where her beautiful young son has a little area containing his own art.

Next was South African Deboran Wright's very large studio at her home in Eagle Heights. Deboran describes her art as the diary of her life. She is experimenting at the moment using bitumen and a range of materials to create layered and textured works.

Our next stop was to Louise Grove Wiechers Red Barn Studio in Eagle Heights. Louise does acrylic painting, printmaking and drawing to express rural living and represent the beautiful natural landscape of the region.

Tony White and Clinton Barker from Larkin Art Projects in North Tamborine have a shop studio in the main street. Tony is an artist with a background in animation and marine biology and Clinton's background is commercial screenwriting and together this makes a very interesting gallery.

We then took advantage of the cafes and fantastic bakery to have some lunch to give us the energy to go on.

Monique Quarantini's studio is hidden in an avocado orchard in a converted dairy shed. She is a talented potter and ceramic artist creating delicate, beautiful, yet functional works of art. Also a past member of HDG. Her works on paper give her an immediacy that she doesn't get with pottery and she incorporates some of the drawings into her pottery using birds and poetry.

After lunch we visited a gallery which was not part of the open studio weekend. The owner of this gallery is Richard Roper and his gallery is opposite the showgrounds and is called Gallery Works. Richard made us coffee and showed us around his studio. He is a past member of the Half Dozen Group and he now has a beautiful gallery which supports and encourages artists by providing studio facilities and professional guidance for drawing, printmaking and sculpture.

Tamborine Mountain Arts Collective in the Showgrounds was our next stop. This is an artists collective and on the day had four artists in residence as well as exhibits of Textiles, Millinery, Painting, Glass, Bookbinding and Leather. Well worth a visit and some lovely items bought.

Our last stop was The Art Gallery Artists Collective which featured painting, drawing, and poetry reading as well as some demonstrations and stalls selling second hand art books and materials.

Lots of bargains to be had.

The most difficult part of the day for me was getting everyone back on the bus to go to the next place as each studio was so interesting everyone wanted more time. At least this gave everyone a taste of the huge amount of talent on The Mountain and hopefully lots of inspiration for their own art journey.
