THE ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM

Dear fellow Half Dozen Group members,

I would like to thank those members (about half of you) who replied to the recent on-line survey. There were some very clear results.

The majority of members reported being happy with activities offered by the Half Dozen Group, happy with its running and with the studio, and for most of us, the HDG is the main art group in our lives. That is good to know and not surprising. The Half Dozen Group has a lot going for it and we have an outstanding website and newsletter.

Members were overwhelmingly optimistic about the future of the HDG, believing that it will continue as it is, or even increase its range of activities and number of members. Those same members, though, with one exception, said they would <u>not</u> consider offering their services as president, secretary, treasurer, membership secretary or building supervisor, even if necessary to ensure the continued running of the group.

Therein lies a problem, and it is a big problem.

In four months it will be time for our February Annual General Meeting. After that, I will no longer be president and Wendy Stevens will not to be secretary. If no-one is willing to take up these posts, the Half Dozen Group will cease to exist. That is the law. After a short time the group would be wound up and its assets distributed to another art group.

This nearly happened last February when I reluctantly agreed to be president. I do not regret that: it has been mostly enjoyable and rewarding, and the committee has been a pleasure to work with, but let me say very clearly that I will not be doing that again. After a number of years in various roles, I will be taking a break from the Half Dozen Group.

The other big issue is that our wonderful studio is not guaranteed. We are currently in negotiation with Brisbane City Council for renewal of our lease, expiring in September next year. Whatever the outcome of those negotiations, the conditions will be at least as onerous as those of our current lease, which, among other things, requires us to spend \$5,000 per year on maintenance. After February, I will not be the building supervisor and so the HDG will need, in addition to a president and secretary, someone to take this role to ensure we meet our lease obligations. Otherwise, the HDG may need to seek alternative accommodation.

We have lost one third of our member numbers in the past five years. There are various reasons for this including sickness and death, sadly. Those of us left are getting older and many of us have played an active part in the running of the Half Dozen Group in the past and are no longer available. The committee has been working hard to attract new and active members to help run the group. There has been some success but this is a slow process and it needs the active support of all members. As part of this, we need to overcome the widely-held perception that, because of our name, we are an exclusive group of six.

The committee has been trying to shield you from these realities, but now it is time to give all members the opportunity to participate in the solution. I have heard some members say that something will turn up or that someone will put up their hand at the last minute, because that has always happened in the past. I do not think we should to rely on this. If we fail to plan, we plan to fail.

IMPORTANT CONT.

First of all, please consider taking on one of the roles that are about to become vacant, or part of the role (the committee is looking at how jobs could be split). It can be very rewarding and enjoyable. By starting the process now, training can be provided and you could be eased into the role. If you are not sure, please let me or another committee member know, and we will happily discuss with you what is involved, and what role might suit you, without any commitment on your part.

Please think whether someone you know might wish to take on one of these jobs. That person need not be an artist, just someone looking for rewarding activity working with a lovely bunch of creative people. There are at least two other local art groups where the president is not an artist, and it is working very well.

Lastly, please take an active role in seeking and encouraging new members at every opportunity and emphasise our open, friendly and egalitarian ethos. Take advantage of the new flyers that are available in the studio for distribution.

The Half Dozen Group of Artists belongs to all of us. Its future is in all of our hands.



Watercolour Workshops With Maria Field

Well known watercolour artist, Maria Field, conducted two consecutive workshops for the HDGA on Saturdays 5th & 12th August. The following is a report from attendee, Derek Johnston:

The Watercolour classes run over two weekends by Maria Field covered a variety of techniques; from basic to more complex, some of which were flat washes, graded washes, wet into wet, variegated and use of dry brush. Maria was always willing to answer any technical issues in a positive and clear manner.

From the best type of Watercolour paper to use and the different effects obtained by pigments and understanding the importance of recognising opaque and transparent colours. The class was attended by some HDG members but the majority were from outside the group and it offered an opportunity to promote what HDG has to offer. Of particular interest was the technique known as pearling which allows for a strong use of positive and negative space.

Overall the workshop was a productive and positive experience and inspired return to Watercolour. Some of the exercises are at right.











Tom recently won First Prize in Photography in the Northern Rivers Bentley Art Awards with his photo of


sheep shearing (right). He has also received Highly Commended awards for two of his paintings, in the Arttimes Ipswich Annual and the Somerset Art Awards respectively.
